USDA Nondiscrimination Statement Communications Overview

Any messaging that advertises hours and access to food must include the current USDA Nondiscrimination Statement. **Please note, the langauge cannot be changed.**

General rule: If the material mentions an FNS program, it must include the statement. This includes handbooks, enrollment forms, menus, newsletters, brochures, ads, flyers, etc.

- Already printed material does not have to be reprinted, but when it is, please be sure to use this statement.
- If sending a public release to a media outlet, it must include the full statement.
- The shorter statement can be used for brief brochures, buttons, posters, etc. but in most cases, the longer version—intact—must be used.

Official Statement

In accordance with Federal law and U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) civil rights regulations and policies, this institution is prohibited from discriminating on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex, (including gender identity and sexual orientation), age, disability, and reprisal or retaliation for prior civil rights activity.
